## Table 1 *Issues at AAUW's National Level*

- How much more do college graduates earn over a lifetime, than non-college graduates?  
 Although results vary by major, overall, a college degree doubles the earnings of a high school graduate over a life time.
- What Year did Title IX Pass and what rights does it protect?  
 1972/Title IX prohibits sex discrimination in education
- Based on current data, if the movement toward equal pay continues at the current rate, what year will women achieve pay equity?  
 2059  
 Females represent 56% of higher education enrollees, but take on more student loans than males, graduate to a pay gap and have less disposable income to repay the loans. They take longer to pay back their loans and as a result, women hold nearly 2/3<sup>rds</sup> of the outstanding loan debt in the US — more than \$800 billion.

- What Percentage of US Governors are women?  
 12%
- What percentage of US Senators and US Representatives are Women?  
 20 -19%
- Approx. what percentage of women are Mayors in 2017 in cities larger than 30,000?  
 19%
- What percentage of Corporate CEO's are women in fortune 500 companies?  
 4%

### Table 3 *Women and Technology*

- What percentage of post college jobs focus on science and technology?  
 US Labor and Statistics: 50% but predictions are that will increase to 77% in the next few years  
 [STEM jobs currently have low unemployment rates, higher salaries and larger job growth than other post college jobs.]
- What percentage of women are in the engineering fields?  
 12%
- How much less do female STEM graduates earn compared to their male counterparts?  
 1/3<sup>rd</sup> less according to Scientific American
- Approximately how many females have flown into orbit as NASA Astronauts?  
 40

### Table 4 *What has AAUW PT Been Up To?*

- What year did Port Townsend's AAUW Branch begin?  
 1947
- Approximately how many dollars in Scholarships has AAUW-PT or UWF provided to local women and girls in the last 5 years?  
 Over \$150,000
- Approximately how many girls have attended Tech Trek camps from the State of Washington in the last 5 years?  
 Over 650
- How many students have received tutoring services from PT Branch members or other volunteers in the last 5 years?  
 Approximately 1,500 students benefited from these programs

## Table 5 *Women Leading the Way*

- What percentage of women reported contributions to candidates for federal office in the 2016 election?  
43%: The highest number of female donors in any national election
- What female was the longest sitting Labor Secretary in US History and the first woman appointed to a US Cabinet position?  
Francis Perkins 1933-1945 executing many aspects of the New Deal
- What year was the First Woman's Rights Conference held in the US which was called the Seneca Falls Convention?  
1848
- Who was the first woman featured on US Currency?  
Pocahontas 1865 – 1869  
or  
Lucy Holcomb Pickens who appeared on confederate bills in 1862

## Table 6 *Women in US History*

- Who was the first woman to run for the office of President of the US (Hint: Which occurred before women could vote)  
Victoria Woodhull ran for President in 1872
- Who was the only member of Congress to vote NO on an emergency vote to declare war on Germany and who opposed participation in US participation in WWII?  
Jeannette Rankin: Montana 1916-1919 and 1941-1943 a life-long pacifist was instrumental in proposing legislation which eventually became the 19th Constitutional Amendment, granting unrestricted voting rights to women championed the causes of gender equality and civil rights throughout a career which spanned more than six decades
- Who was called the "First Lady of the World" for her work on Human Rights?  
Eleanor Roosevelt
- When did women of color attain the right to vote in the US?  
1964
